- F. Report of the Gill-Montague Representative- Theresa K. reported that the TFHS and GFMS have had a great start to the beginning of the FY19-20 school year. The majority of last years graduating sixth graders continued to Great Falls Middle School. Joanie Menard joined the school this year as new principal. The seniors participated in a special event on the first day of school including; music and red-carpet entrance. The event was such a success that it will be continued every

Monday morning. There will be no TFHS football team this year. 9 students are currently playing with the Mohawk team. Booster Day and Senior night will be held at Turners. All other games will be away. A civic leaders meeting took place regarding the merging of Pioneer and Turners Falls High School. The towns of Pioneer will be conducting a vote to put together a committee of 18 members to study the potential merger. Erving has been invited to add three members; making the committee 21 members. It has been predicted that the process will take 3-4 years and another 1-2 years to implement the findings.

- G. Collaborative for Educational Services Report- Next meeting Wednesday September 25, 2019
- H. Capital Planning Committee Update- Bruce Turner stated that they are in the process of finding carpeting to be installed over Christmas Break. The Town of Erving has excess money from a "Pothole" account that will be used to fund the project.
- I. Superintendent's Report- Superintendent Jennifer Haggerty reported that the leadership team is scheduled for a Leadership Conference on the Universal Design for Learning. Erving Elementary School opening day was a huge success as usual. The leadership team shared speeches, quotes, and poems. Johnathon Mooney was a wonderful keynote speaker. The superintendent welcomed Lisa Candito as new principal of Erving Elementary School and Rhonda Cohen as new principal of Leverett Elementary School.
- J. **Director of Finance and Operations Report-** The central office computer systems were hacked twice in June. Systems are now back up and all information is hosted by Google and the Cloud. Bruna Marsh will be retiring in the next couple months. Currently in the process of finding a new hire to replace her.

Motion to make end of year transfers- Bruce Turner asked the Committee to transfer \$235.60 from the Food Service Account to the Food Service Revolving Fund to cover student debt. K. Principal's Report*-

- 1. Enrollment- 133 students. Enrollment is up by 2 students from last year.
- 2. Personnel- Principal Candito welcomed 4 new staff members. Cole Hogg as the new PE teacher, Jennifer Fay as a part-time office assistant, Ann Grosky as long-term substitute for Beth McCoy, and Pam Ososky as the long-term substitute for

- Molly Alvin who is out on Maternity Leave. Five interviews will be conducted on Thursday to fill Beth McCoys position.
- **3.** Lunch Program Update-EES is now in the Provision 2 lunch program. We no longer qualify for the CEP Program. It is imperative that we collect Free/Reduced lunch applications from as many families as possible to qualify for the CEP program in the future. Breakfast and Lunch will still be provided free to students. The bracket that the school is placed in determines the reimbursement amount.
- **4.** Program Updates- The first fire drill of the year took place on September 9, 2019. Students and staff did a great job. A lockdown drill is scheduled with Trooper Charmichael for later in the Fall. The school received an early literacy grant for grades Pre-k-3rd. Ten teachers will be involved in the project. They will focus on writing in different meetings and trainings. There will also be a variety of consultants coming in to work on literacy. Social Emotional Learning with Chip Wood will begin tomorrow with staff. He will lead a series of 8 meetings with staff and a 5 event parent series where parents will receive a book to work from at each event.
- **5.** PTO Report-EES PTO has started off the year strong. They just completed a Mums fundraiser where students sold over 300 plants to benefit their classes. The PTO is currently collecting raffle items for baskets to be raffled off after open house. Each class is responsible for a different themed basket. Saturday September 28th the PTO will be partnering with the Erving Recreation Department to host the Erving Fall Festival. PTO will have an informational table with free apple cider.
- L. Building and Grounds- Gary, Erik, and Collin did an amazing job preparing the building for the new school year. All summer maintenance was completed in the main building as well as the kitchen. The carpet in room 104 was replaced due to odor and other issues. Gary has done a great job getting rid of the wasp problem. All repairs have been started or completed in Mrs. Glabach's Pre-k classroom. Sixth graders are currently at Natures Classroom until Friday.
