The CNC children's closet in Leverett is free to all. They try to stock formula when possible. CNC sponsors and puts on so many different activities and programs for our youngest learners. There are CNC playgroups, story walks, and the Ready Rosie program. Gillian requested the return of the Sunday morning playgroup at EES. Currently the funding for CNC for 2023 is only \$83,789. Gillian concluded her presentation by reading statements from former and current CNC program participants.

- M. Principal's Report- The EES Band has been putting on a virtual instrument show and tell every Thursday in May. The 6th graders will be visiting Great Falls Middle School on June 1st with Graduation on June 16th. There will be an Art Night with Pizza on June 2nd. The Birds of Prey will be coming on June 7th. The Early Education Team is wrapping up Pre-k and Kindergarten registrations. As of now there will be 20 pre-k students and 13 possibly 14 Kindergarteners in the Fall. The Pre-k tuition has been raised to \$10 a day for ½ or full days beginning in September. Mary Gillman and Polly Wagner will be leaving at the end of the school year. An Occupational Therapist has been selected to take Mary Gillmans position. Mr. J and Lynn Osky will be going to Swift River full time next year. Interviews have begun to fill both of those positions.
